



The Consecration of the XI Bishop of Nevada

Dear friends in Christ,

Today I share with you joyful news. I am pleased to announce the Consecration and Ordination of The Rev Elizabeth Bonforte Gardner as Nevada's XI Bishop Diocesan will take place at 11 am Pacific Time on Saturday, March 5, 2022, at Christ Episcopal Church, 2000 South Maryland Parkway, in Las Vegas.

Later this week, we will send invitations to Bishops of the more than 100 dioceses of the Church; Bishops and leaders of the Interfaith Communities in Nevada; local Bishops of the Evangelical Lutheran Church; state and local civic leaders; and members of the clergy and laity of the diocese.

The consecration is fewer than eight weeks away and COVID is spiking quite a bit in the state. *Indeed, the worldwide Episcopal Church (DFMS) has suspended all churchwide in-person meetings through February 28, 2022 (Shrove Tuesday).* Currently, we are not sure how to handle in-person attendance. The standing committee, with consultation of diocesan staff, will join with the Bishop-Elect, and the Presiding Bishop's office to ensure attendees can make any necessary travel arrangements.

I can pledge the service will be livestreamed and will be available live on both YouTube and Facebook.
